# Passage One, #1

- Which idea does the poet most associate with the image of flowers?
- The correct answer is C, conformity.
- A is incorrect because the poet references no sort of competition. B is incorrect because the author gives no evidence of a complicated life. D is incorrect because no confusion is shown. The flowers are described as being comfortable in their boring lives.

# #2

- What type of literary device does the first line of the poem contain?
- The correct answer is A, Simile
- B is incorrect because it is comparing two unlike things, but it uses the words like or as. C is incorrect because there is no combining of two unlike things into one thing. D is incorrect because there is no humorous truth that contradicts what is considered common. A is correct, because the literary device shown has the word as in a comparison of two unlike things, therefore making it a simile.

# #3

- What does the speaker desire in lines 4-12?
- The correct answer is B, the freedom to live life as he chooses.
- The author says nothing of power or independence through out the poem, which rules out A and D. C can also be eliminated, because any locations he mentions are figurative, as shown by the way they are described.

# #4

- Which term or phrase best expresses the meaning of the word seed as used in line 11?
- The correct answer is D, spiritual being.
- This is pretty much explicitly stated, as he says, 'carrying my soul, my **seed**, beyond the mountains of time.' None of the other choices (body, common sense, or scent) are remotely near the idea of his soul.

# #5

- What effect does the poet achieve by repeating the phrase "I'd rather"?
- D, reinforcement of the poems theme of personal desire, is the right answer.
- A is not correct because the phrase doesn't contribute with the amount of syllables in each stanza. B is not correct because the poem does not even rhyme. C is not correct because the title just gives off what the author is talking about and doesn't really relate to the phrase.

# Passage Two, #6

- Which device or technique used in the poem creates a conversational tone?
- C, free verse, is the right answer.
- A is not correct because using incomplete sentences doesn't show a conversation or a conversational tone in a poem. B is not correct because, while it does use figurative language, it's not used in a way to give off a conversational tone to it. D isn't correct because the poem doesn't use slang.

# #7

- Which phrase contains a metaphor?
- The answer is D, coming back/from the bellies of iron whales.
- A is not comparing. B is not comparing. C is a simile. It is D because a metaphor is a comparison not using like or as

# #8

- What literary device helps develop a religious theme in the poem?
- The correct answer is B, figurative language.
- The other answers you can find a little in the poem but doesn't relate to a religious theme. This whole poem is basically all figurative language.

# #9

- What does the speaker most likely mean by referring to his father as an apparition? (Line 4)
- The correct answer is A, he was like a stranger to his family.
- New lands is used after that so you know by that it can't be frighten and C is just completely wrong.

# #10

- Which literary device does the author use in line 3?
- The correct answer is C, Simile.
- That answer is correct because the first line is making a comparison using as.

# #11

- As suggested by word choice in lines 4-8, what is the family's relationship with the father?
- The correct answer is A, admiring but distant.
- None of the other answers make sense. Nowhere in the poem doesn't it mention anything resentful, tense or frustrated.

# #12

- In mythology, sirens used their voices to lure sailors off course. According to the speaker, what did the family's siren song encourage the father to do?
- The correct answer is D, to return home as often as possible.
- Religion is not touched upon in the poem, so B is incorrect. He did not resign from the military, so C is wrong. And between the two that are left, D is the best choice.

# #13

- What phrase is most helpful in creating an adoring tone towards the father?
- The correct answer is A, a round cap on his head like a halo.
- The choice of words gives the father a heavenly quality, while the others are more earthly ideas.
